Throughout the Year Around the Zone

The ladies at Gethsemane delivered 100 school kits and 22 tie quilts to the Ingathering for LWML on November 7th. They decorated their church for Christmas and hope to begin meeting next year.

Beautiful Savior women are sending 40 quilts to Orphan Grain Train. They are currently collecting toiletries and socks for a homeless shelter. Monetary donations have been made to Bethesda Lutheran Home, Deaf Youth Ministry, Lutheran Bible Translators, Lutheran Braille Workers, LAMP and Upbring. They have also collected socks for foster children and will be hosting an Undie Sunday in January (collecting all sizes of undies) for Orphan Grain Train.

Concordia's Women's Club has taken 60 school kits, 50 health care kits and 212 quilts to Orphan Grain Train. They collected over 120 Christmas toys for the children at DePelchin Children's Center and an SUV full of food for the Food Pantry. Throughout the year, 80 sympathy, get well, and thinking of you cards were mailed. Twenty Love Bags were assembled with goodies for Christmas for the shut-ins and others on the prayer list.
