#### RULES FOR LWML TEXAS DISTRICT CONVENTION, JUNE 20, 2020

#### LWML TEXAS DISTRICT BYLAWS, Article VI—CONVENTIONS AND REPRESENTATION

#### Section 4

The members of the convention who shall have voice and vote shall be:

- a. one (1) certified delegate from each society having twenty (20) or less members and one (1) additional delegate for each additional twenty (20) members or major fraction thereof as of December 31 preceding the convention;
- b. voting members of the Board of Directors; Zone Presidents unable to attend are allowed an alternate representative, who shall have vote and voice, but who shall not be considered a member of the Board. (See ARTICLE XII, Section 1 b).
- all past LWML Texas District Presidents who are currently members of LWML and reside in the district.

#### Section 5

A member of the voting assembly shall vote in one (1) capacity. Proxy votes are prohibited.

#### Section 7

A majority of the registered voting assembly shall constitute a quorum.

\_\_\_\_\_

#### 1) CREDENTIALS

- a) Prior to the transaction of any business, the credentials chairman will present a role of delegates eligible to vote to the parliamentarian for the electronic voting program, Election Runner. The parliamentarian will conduct a practice vote to determine all eligible delegates have the ability to vote and present results to the credentials chairman to prepare a credentials report.
- b) A credentials report will be verified by a vote to approve the convention rules on June 16, 2020 and presented for approval to all voting delegates in an election held on June 17, 2020 and will apply to all votes.
- c) Upon proper clearance by the credentials chairman (Vice President of Organizational Resources), a member registered as an alternate may be transferred from alternate to delegate up until noon on June 18, 2020 and shall retain the position change through the remainder of the convention.

#### 2) CONDUCT OF BUSINESS

- a) Only certified delegates and alternates may introduce business, debate and vote.
- b) A list of candidates, proposed bylaws amendments, recommendation from the Board of Directors for an additional new endowment, work program, and proposed mission grants will be posted on the district website. Any delegate may request them by mail or email if needed.
- c) Discussion of the proposed bylaw amendments, work program and the new endowment, and an opportunity to make nominations for offices and the nominating committee will be held during the first week of June and be open to all voting delegates through a discussion board, email or by phone. Any new business, motions or nominations received must have a second and be presented in writing to the president (by email or on the discussion board). Nominations must include written permission from the nominee and biographical information.
- d) All voting will be conducted electronically using Election Runner. Voting will be open for 4 hours for each vote and split into segments on June 16-18, 2020.
- e) A convention rule may be suspended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates.

#### 3) PARTICIPATION FOR ALL MEMBERS

- a) Due to restrictions from the pandemic, a virtual convention will be held on June 20, 2020 from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. All election results will be announced during the live stream.
- b) The convention will include a worship service, keynote speaker, Mites in Action Speaker, Bible studies by the pastoral counselors and reports.
- c) A convention offering for the LWML Texas District 2020-2022 Mite Goal will be gathered by mail and electronically.

WHEREAS, individuals in the aftermath of disaster need God's Word and physical help; and

WHEREAS, Lutheran Disaster Care ministry is a whole person (body and soul) ministry and part of that ministry is providing Bibles and devotional materials for spiritual care and comfort and gift cards to meet a small part of their immediate help for the bodily needs of disaster victims; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention vote the sum of \$15,000 to help fund Lutheran Disaster Care Blessings and Bibles ministry.

# 2. Scholarships for Seminarians — Texas District LCMS — \$40,000

WHEREAS, Christ commanded His Church on earth to go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Triune God: and

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod provides seminary training for dedicated men to become ordained ministers who teach the Word and administer the Sacraments to God's people, including those who have never heard the Gospel; and

WHEREAS, the need for pastors to fill pulpits and mission stations of the LCMS is increasingly great at huge financial sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, the LWML Texas District Golden Triangle Zone has voted approval and the Texas District LCMS has approved the mission grant proposal with sincere appreciation for past support; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$20,000 to help fund the multicultural ministries of Glocal Mission, Houston.

# 4. Mercy Meals — Orphan Grain Train — \$5,000

WHEREAS, Jesus had compassion on the multitudes when they were hungry and fed them miraculously with loaves and fish (Matthew 14 and 15) and said that whenever we feed the hungry, we feed Him (Matthew 25); and

WHEREAS, world hunger continues to be a pressing problem, especially among children in Third World countries; and

WHEREAS, Mercy Meals addresses the desperate need of world hunger in orphanages, refugee camps, and disaster

relief centers (sending food packets to 36 countries, including the United States last year); and

WHEREAS, Orphan Grain Train hopes to double the number of meal packets shipped; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$5,000 to Orphan Grain Train — Mercy Meals to achieve this goal.

# 5. Neighborhood Outreach in North Houston — Lazarus Lutheran Church — \$10,000

WHEREAS, our Lord Jesus Christ commanded us to make disciples of all nations; and

WHEREAS, the spiritual needs of the growing population of primarily young families in the mission focus area of the Lazarus Lutheran Church plant in North Houston are not being adequately met by local Christian churches; and

WHEREAS, financial assistance would magnify and greatly extend the already existing outreach potential of the Lazarus Lutheran Church plant; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$10,000 for the purchase of neighborhood outreach supplies and "Parties with a Purpose" scholarships to extend the Gospel in North Houston.

# 6. Multiethnic Pastoral Formation — LINC Houston — \$20,000

WHEREAS, our heavenly Father's desire is to see the Gospel proclaimed to all nations, disciples made and churches planted for His glory; and

WHEREAS, the growing need arises to provide coaching, training, and support for the formation of multiethnic pastors for the work of the harvest; and

WHEREAS, traditional pathways are often financially out of reach for multiethnic

communities to adequately support local leaders for pastoral formation; and

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod seminaries are aware of the need to reach multiethnic communities with the Gospel and provide pathways for pastoral formation in this generation and generations to come; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention vote the sum of \$20,000 to help fund the multiethnic pastoral formation to the glory of God.

# 7. Reaching Immigrants and Refugees — Multi-Ethnic Ministry of North Texas — \$12,000

WHEREAS, the Lord Jesus commanded His Church to go and make disciples of all nations by baptizing them and teaching them; and

WHEREAS, the efforts to reach out to the refugees and immigrants coming to Texas, specifically to the Dallas area have shown good results of children baptized and confirmed; and

WHEREAS, the Multi-Ethnic Ministry of North Texas is positioned to best serve the spiritual and physical needs of these refugees and immigrants with pastoral counsel and Divine service as well as recruiting future leaders for the new church plants; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$12,000 to spread the Gospel message to these people in the greater Dallas-Fort Worth area.

#### 8. Lutheran Student Center Improvements — Lubbock — \$20,000

WHEREAS, our Lord Jesus Christ, in His Holy Work, has charged us to go and make disciples of all nations; and

WHEREAS, the Lutheran Student Center is an active, growing ministry to young adults and students in the Lubbock area; and

WHEREAS, a synod-trained pastor leads the ministry, and the facility provides a place for students to study, cook in the

kitchen, and "hangout" with other Christian friends: and

WHEREAS, the Lutheran Student Center is in dire need of much deferred maintenance, mainly flooring and exterior paint, for students from all over the world to call this their "home"; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$20,000 to help fund the improvements of the building to support the mission work among students from all faiths and nations at the Lutheran Student Center, Lubbock, Texas.

# 9. DCE Scholarships — Concordia University Texas — \$24,000

WHEREAS, our Lord Jesus Christ was a teacher to His disciples and provided all of us with an enduring mission of teaching future generations about God and His love; and

WHEREAS, we must be dedicated to the task of training the next generation of leaders in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod; and

WHEREAS, the mission of Concordia University Texas is "Concordia University Texas empowers students of all backgrounds to lead lives of critical thought, compassionate action, and courageous leadership"; and

WHEREAS, the university's Director of Christian Education program, while successful in developing such leaders, needs broad scholarship support to expand and enhance participation; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Texas District Lutheran Women's Missionary League in convention vote the sum of \$24,000 to fund scholarships in Director of Christian Education program at Concordia University Texas.

# 10. Urban Base Camp Outreach — Camp Lone Star — \$15,000

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word charged us to reach out to all nations, instructed parents to bring up their children in the way of the Lord, and asked that little children be brought to Him; and

WHEREAS, Camp Lone Star is an established mission field of Lutheran Outdoors Ministry of Texas in La Grange, Texas, providing programs to vastly expand the Christian knowledge of children and adults; and

WHEREAS, Camp Lone Star has established Urban Base Camp for children aged 5–13 to partner with congregations in their urban settings, placing the Gospel message into many homes not currently connected with local churches; and

WHEREAS, up-to-date and appropriate mobile materials for active programs benefit children, enhancing spiritual, physical, and social growth; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention vote the sum of \$15,000 to help fund the mobile rock climbing wall for Urban Base Camp.

# 11. Training Leaders in Israel — Apple of His Eye — \$10,000

WHEREAS, the Apple of His Eye Mission Society exists to BOLDLY declare Y'shua as Messiah and URGENTLY equip God's people to do the same, consistent with Romans1:16 (NIV), I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile; and

WHEREAS, the Apple of His Eye Mission Society has taken the Great Commission to heart, sharing the Gospel with the lost in America, and has now expanded into Israel; and

WHEREAS, the strategy in Israel includes sharing Y'shua as Messiah and equipping God's people through training leaders who need resources like Hebrew catechetical texts and Hebrew New Testaments; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$10,000 to equip Israeli Jewish leaders to be trained so they may BOLDLY declare Y'shua as Messiah in Israel.

#### 12. Multiplying Lutheran Partners — **Resurrection Mobility Mission, Spring** — \$15,000

WHEREAS, Christ commanded us to make disciples of all nations, including children (Psalm 78:4, Matthew 19:14) and the disabled (Luke 14:12-14, John 9:3-5); and

WHEREAS, a great percentage of children with disabilities and their families become isolated, the expense of a wheelchair can cost a year's wages, and the body of Christ can offer increased community and new freedoms; and

WHEREAS, Resurrection Lutheran Mobility Mission for more than 15 years has provided mobility to children with disabilities in the Third World, shared the Gospel alongside indigenous workers, and trained sister congregations to lead short-term Gospel teams; and

WHEREAS, sister congregations desire to proclaim the Gospel, provide mercy, and increase mission internationally and locally, but are unable to fully finance the endeavor. therefore be it

RESOLVED. that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$15,000 to multiply Lutheran partners to expand Gospel impact and new freedoms to children with disabilities.

#### 13. E-Kids After School Program — Expansion Ministries, Inc. — \$20,000

WHEREAS, our Lord Jesus said to let little children come to Him and not to hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven: and

WHEREAS, Expansion Ministries, Inc. is implementing our Lord's command by reaching out to children through the E-Kids after school apartment ministries program where their spiritual, physical, and intellectual needs are met; and

WHEREAS, the ministry has seen good results introducing children to the saving grace of Christ Jesus, and, in turn, making a positive impact on their families, and

WHEREAS, the ministry is positioned to grow and reach out to other impoverished

communities in the greater Dallas area, encouraging children of all ages to come to Him; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in Convention grant \$20,000 to spread the Gospel message to these children and their families to the Glory of God.

#### 14. Laundry Love — St. Paul, San Antonio — \$12,000

WHEREAS, our Lord Jesus Christ in the 25<sup>th</sup> chapter of St. Matthew's Gospel exhorted us. His followers, to engage and serve our neighbors who are the least among us; and

WHEREAS, St. Paul Lutheran Church, San Antonio, has been blessed by God to be positioned in a neighborhood with many who are in material and spiritual need; and

WHEREAS, laundromats are a unique setting for helping those who are the least among us by serving, feeding, financially assisting, and sharing the Good News; and

WHEREAS, this service and outreach requires significant resources and support; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$12,000 for St. Paul Lutheran Laundry Love ministry to pay laundry expenses one evening a month and provide food, games, crafts, Bible lessons, prayer, and fellowship.

#### 15. Let the Little Children Come — St. Paul, Dallas — \$20,000

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word has called for us to let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven; and

WHEREAS, St. Paul Lutheran Church and Christian Academy is located in a poor community of mostly unchurched families and offers the only Christ-centered preschool and before and after school care for neighborhood children; and

WHEREAS, most families who live in poverty do not have reliable transportation and many elders cannot drive; and

WHEREAS, a 15-passenger van will provide needed transportation to bring more little children to St. Paul Christian Academy and the aged and handicapped to church to hear Christ proclaimed; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention vote the sum of \$20,000 to St. Paul Lutheran Church and Christian Academy to purchase a van to reach those in need of His Word and mercy ministry.

# 16. Multicultural Youth Ministries — Bethel, Dallas — \$10,000

WHEREAS, Christ on numerous occasions made it clear that the Gospel is to be preached to all nations; and

WHEREAS, God is bringing "all nations" to live in the Bethel Lutheran Dallas area; and

WHEREAS, there is a great opportunity for the congregation to become multicultural, particularly in the area of youth ministry, as they engage their diverse community; and

WHEREAS, Bethel Lutheran Church in East Dallas has already expanded to include worship for Hispanic and African refugee families; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$10,000 to help Bethel Lutheran Church in East Dallas develop a Multicultural Youth Ministry.

# 17. Creating a Network of Hope — Driving Hope of Texas — \$20,000

WHEREAS, The human spirit can endure in sickness, but a crushed spirit who can bear? (Proverbs 18:14 NIV); and

WHEREAS, Driving Hope of Texas is regularly used by poor and elderly riders who are underserved by secular agencies; and

WHEREAS, the growing number of patients who use Driving Hope of Texas for medical transportation often reveal their spiritual battles against feelings of hopelessness and abandonment; and

WHEREAS, partnerships with local LCMS congregations and their care

ministries in the service area are urgently needed so that Driving Hope of Texas can facilitate a natural continuum of spiritual care and non-medical assistance for these neglected patients before and after rides to treatment; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$20,000 to Driving Hope of Texas to develop a formal Network of Hope among the region's LCMS congregations to bring God's mercy and spiritual healing to poor and elderly patients.

# 18. Translating LWML Bible Studies — WORDrus — \$11,000

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word charged us to, "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-20); and

WHEREAS, there is a great need for lay Bible studies in Eurasia, especially Russia, where there is an opportunity to reach 166 million Russian speakers (including 30 million outside of Russia); and

WHEREAS, the LWML shared the LWML Donna Pyle Bible Study Series with WORDrus for translation into Russian and other languages to educate laypersons in Biblical truths and Lutheran doctrine/theology; and

WHEREAS, WORDrus is an LCMS RSO with experience to provide costeffective translation of biblical, Lutheran resources; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District in convention grant \$11,000 for WORDrus to translate the LWML Donna Pyle Bible Study Series into Russian and German.


