FROM OUR ZONE PRESIDENT

Dear Sisters in Christ,

It is the middle of July as I am writing this letter to you, and it has been a tumultuous year. My sister-in-law died on Christmas Eve last year, which led to a month away from home, getting my brother's rented house cleared out, and moving him from Arizona to Hutto, where he lives with our sister. February was full of getting ready for the Zone Presidents Training weekend, followed by our zone retreat. On March 6, our son-in-law, who had ALS, was taken to the hospital with severe breathing problems. There he had a tracheostomy and was moved to a specialty hospital, where another major medical crisis led to his death in April. In May, one of my friends died unexpectedly. And in June, I lost two more friends who had been battling cancer.

Good things were happening too. There were birthdays; my sister and her husband from Colorado spent a week with us in March; the national LWML convention in June; my husband and I celebrated our 55th anniversary.

God has been right beside me through all the ups and downs of this year. He has provided strength for every day. He comforted me and still comforts me as I mourn my losses; and rejoices with me as I celebrate all the good things in my life.

"Though the fig tree should not blossom, nor fruit be on the vines, the produce of the olive fail and the fields yield no food, the flock be cut off from the fold, and there be no herd in stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will take joy in the God of my salvation."
