The year of our Lord two thousand twenty-four is here! There is much to be accomplished over the next six months as the 2024 Convention Host Committee continues to plan for the



Assembly of Leaders (AOL) is a training session held every four years by LWML. Five members of the LWML Texas District attended the sessions held in October 2022. Filled with fun, facts, and features, the AOL time together is a great means of providing training in leadership skills, information on all the resources available to the members, and how each department is relevant to the mission of LWML. I have encouraged the presidents of neighboring zones to work together and plan an AOL session. There are six trained leaders that can be called upon to facilitate the training. The zones provide the facilities and, of course, eager attendees!

The first training session was incorporated into the Zone Presidents Orientation held in February 2023. Zones from the Greater Houston area, which include Bayou City, Gulf Coast, New Horizon, Golden Harvest, and White Oak, conducted a successful gathering this past August. Another is planned for the south Texas area in April 2024. This takes in the Mid Coast, Coastal Bend, and Rio Grande Valley. There is much more Texas District to reach.
