Proclaiming Christ to People Who Are Blind or Visually Impaired



Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) exists to bring the Word of God to the 338 million people throughout the world who are blind or visually impaired, completely free of charge, in braille and specialized large print. In over 80 years of ministry, LBW has produced and distributed over 15 million volumes of Christian material, in 40 languages, to people in 164 countries. LBW has never charged a recipient to receive these materials as they believe in freely sharing God's Word!

Men, women, and children find hope in the Light of Christ through the Bible and other Christian materials provided by LBW in multiple languages in every part of the globe. LBW is one of the last remaining free resources available to them in which the Good News of Jesus is shared guickly and in


high quality formats.

Grant at the 2024 LWML Texas District Convention. With mission grant funds, LBW, along with Texas volunteers will produce approximately 2,500 volumes of new Bible studies, devotions, or Spanish prison ministry materials, in braille and specialized large print formats, to share the Gospel and Jesus' love with people in Texas, the United States, or worldwide who are blind or visually impaired.

One major factor in Lutheran Braille Workers ability to reach thousands of people every single year is the volunteer work force dedicated to sharing the Gospel. LBW has over 3,200 volunteers engaged in this ministry across the country. Through the Lutheran Braille Workers partnership with the LWML, and the countless volunteers in Texas and throughout the country, many who are blind or visually impaired and wanting to know Jesus as their personal Savior will be able to experience the love of Christ for themselves.

Mission Grant Proposals Being Accepted for the 2026-28 Biennium

Mission grant proposals for the LWML Texas District are now being accepted. Proposals need to be submitted by **November 1**. It is strongly recommended you communicate with the VP of Gospel Outreach by Oct. 1.

Any LWML member, group, or zone of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Texas District may submit mission grant proposals.

Do you have a ministry that could benefit from a mission grant? If so, the ministry should:



Be mission-focused. Applicants must demonstrate clearly how the mission grant will promote or support the proclamation of the Gospel to all.

Align with the goals and objectives of the Texas District LCMS.

Be current and ready for implementation.

Be ongoing in nature, with a plan for continuance after the mission grant money has been expended.

Be well-documented.

Request funding for no more than two years to correspond with the LWML biennium.

Agencies, organizations, and programs that help people to serve, grow, and spread God's Word will be considered.
